

What is Public Involvement?

- Two-way communication
 - Solicitation of public comments
 - Responding to public comments
- Gain understanding of community issues and needs, which can help inform transportation design/decision-making
- Comply with federal and state requirements
- Public Participation = Public Ownership
- Collaboration reflects community values and better projects





Who is the Public?

- People who live, work, go to school, visit a business in the area
- People who use the roadway, sidewalk, transit
- People who have a business on the corridor
- People who own property
- People who regulate an aspect
- Anyone who is affected by or interested in the project





NEPA

- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)-1969
- Requires consideration of environmental effects and reasonable alternatives
- Environmental natural, <u>human</u>, physical
- FDOT's Project Development & Environmental (PD&E) process is state procedure for complying with NEPA regulations


